Tony said only the votes that were cast count toward the total. The IG Reps do have the right to abstain from voting. Election is won on two-thirds of the votes cast.

The first round was tied at 18 each for Amy & Hank. There were thirty-six votes cast with thirty-nine voting members.

Since there was a tie, a second round was held, again, by written ballot, the votes were again read by Cecelia & Brenda and counted by Colleen. There were thirty-seven total votes, twenty-one for Hank, sixteen for Amy. This did not meet the two-thirds requirement; another vote was needed.

A third vote was made by written ballot, again read by Cecilia & Brenda, and counted by Colleen.

The votes were 38 total:

26 for Hank, 12 for Amy.

Hank was elected as the next Steering Committee At Large Member.

Tony thanked everyone for their willingness to serve, and he thanked Amy for her service at the MAIA office.

New Business

A motion to adjourn was made, the motion was seconded, no discussion was needed.

The meeting ended at 2:10 pm with the Serenity Prayer.

Before the prayer, Gayle (Traditions) asked about discussion about bylaws, Tony (MAIA Chair) stated that he had already asked for new business and discussion could bring this up at the next meeting.

Total Income for February 2026 was \$ (490.46) less than budgeted due to lower than anticipated merchandise sales.

Total Cost of Goods was \$ (206.90) less than budgeted due to lower than anticipated merchandise sales.

This leaves a Gross Profit variance to budget before expenses of \$ (283.56) less than budgeted.

Expenses for February 2026 were \$ (197.38) less than budgeted.

Net income variance to budget was \$ (106.47) less than budgeted.

Total Income YTD thru February 2026 was \$ (1,683.13) less than budgeted.

Total Cost of Goods was \$ (4,375.05) less than budgeted.

This leaves a Gross Profit variance to budget before expenses of \$ 2,863.93 more than budgeted.

Expenses for YTD thru February 2026 were \$ 445.88 more than budgeted.

Net income variance to budget was \$ 2,418.05 More than budgeted.

Notes

Our February Net income was \$106 less than budgeted, and our YTD Net Income through February was \$2,418.05 more than budgeted. This appears to be mostly due to timing of purchases and contributions.

Items of note: Bank Service Charges include credit card fees. In January there was a payment for Ring Central for the doorbell camera of \$312.34 exceeding the budget. This is a one time per year payment and was not budgeted so this variance will remain throughout the year. Computer expenses are approximately \$100 per month over budget due to Quickbooks fees - there was an increase and it appears that we budgeted lower than actual This variance will remain throughout the

The Bank Statement Balance as of 2/27/26 was \$ 11,942.24

The Prudent Reserve Statement Balance as of 2/27/26 was \$ 38,531.34

***Our Prudent reserve is 89% of the 6 month goal. If we continue to have positive net income we will transfer some more to reserve in March.

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OFFICE REPORT – March 2026

2026 Ad Hoc Committee Report

At the IG Rep's meeting February 8, 2026, Jim C., shared the purpose of the 2026 Ad Hoc Committee, and presented a report on the committee's findings. The full report was included in the February 2026 IG Rep E-blast.

The IG Reps were asked to review the Ad hoc Committee findings and to be prepared to discuss them on March 8, 2026, IG Rep meeting.

AAWS Literature Price Increase:

Effective March 3, 2026, Memphis Area Intergroup Association will implement a 15% price increase on English and Spanish literature items. Standard rounding will be applied to all adjusted prices.

This change follows the pricing adjustment announced by A.A. World Services (AAWS), which became effective February 1, 2026.

At its December meeting the AAWS Board approved.

- A \$3.00 increase per book
- A 15% increase on all other literature items
- Standard rounding applied to all new prices

The M.A.I.A. Office Manager and Treasurer agreed to place a bulk order and would like to recommend a 15% price increase, effective March 3, 2026.
